CYANARA50® CYANIDE PASTE FOR THE CONTROL OF POSSUMS

Contains 500g/kg Potassium Cyanide in the form of a paste

Cyanara50 Cyanide Paste must be under the control of an Approved Handler and applied by a person holding a Controlled Substance Licence.

Take all reasonable steps to ensure that the substance does not cause any significant adverse effects to the environment beyond the application area. Do not apply directly into or onto water.

WARNING:

Can be fatal if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through the skin. Product generates highly toxic hydrogen cyanide gas on contact with acids. Eye irritant. Causes a mild skin irritation and may cause an allergic skin reaction. Suspected of damaging fertility or the unborn child. Causes damage to organs. Very toxic to fish, in soil environment, to terrestrial vertebrates and terrestrial invertebrates.

PRECAUTIONS:

Store in closed original container in a cold dry place away from foodstuffs and under lock and key. Use only outdoors or in well ventilated area. Do not get in eyes, on skin and or on clothing. Wear washable overalls and PVC or rubber gloves when applying baits. Wash hands and exposed skin thoroughly after handling and before eating, smoking or rest breaks. A cyanide emergency kit should be available on the premises where Cyanara50 paste is stored and persons should be trained in the correct procedures for first aid and resuscitation. Avoid release to environment.

SYMPTOMS OF POISONING:

Can include dizziness, rapid breathing, headache, drowsiness, rapid pulse, and convulsions. Skin contaminated with cyanide will feel slimy and cold

FIRST AID:

If exposed or concerned, get medical advice. For advice, contact National Poisons Centre, **0800 POISON (0800 764 766)**. If person feels unwell or symptoms develop, get immediate medical attention. If ingested, or suspected inhalation of cyanide gas, remove to fresh air, keep warm and at rest. **CALL AN AMBULANCE, DIAL 111**. Have the victim rinse mouth thoroughly with water and do not induce vomiting. If vomiting occurs naturally, rinse mouth and repeat administering water. If Cyanara50 comes in contact with skin, remove contaminated clothing and wash the affected area with plenty of running water. **DO NOT SCRUB THE SKIN**. If in contact with the eyes, flush with running water for at least 15 minutes. **TAKE TO THE HOSPITAL IMMEDIATELY IF RECOVERY IS NOT COMPLETE. SPILLAGE:

Wear gloves. Scrape up spilt paste with a tool and bury along with other contaminated material. Prevent spilt material entering drains and waterways. Do not wash away with water. Absorb with dry sand or other inert absorbent and collect safely.
Place in sealable labelled containers for disposal as hazardous waste.

DISPOSAL:

Containers partially empty or product – Dispose of through an appropriate hazardous chemical disposal company.
Empty containers – Crush and burn, or bury the container at a depth of at least 300mm.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE:

Massage the tube well before using. Remove the overcap. Cut the nozzle to open the tube. Set pea-sized baits on surfaces in the shade. Place Cyanara50 Cyanide paste bait down first, then lay flour and milk powder attractant around the bait, but do not place under or over the bait. Do not set baits on blaze portion of trees. Recap the tube when not in use.

LIVESTOCK:

It is extremely important to prevent access to baits by domestic livestock and pets. Stock must be kept out of the treatment area until baits have been removed or destroyed.

LEGAL OBLIGATIONS:

This product must be sold only to or used by a person holding a Controlled Substance Licence issued by a Test Certifier who has been approved by the ACVM group. Additional permissions may be required depending on method of use and location of use. Signs must be erected at every point of entry to the place where the bait is to be used. Signs must remain in place for not less than 2 months after the last date on which the bait was laid and until baits are retrieved, destroyed, have disintegrated or are no longer toxic. This product must only be used as specified in the label.

SHELF LIFE:

Any product held after the expiry date shown on the tube should be disposed of according to the label instructions.
